Subject: -Grant of 2nd renewal of permission to Monark Ayurved Medical College & Hospital, At. & Post Vahelal, Naroda-Dahegam Road, Ta. Dascroi, Dist. Ahmedabad-382330, Gujarat (Inst. ID. AYU0713) with 54 seats (instead of 60 seats) in UG (BAMS) course, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25-regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

- Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Monark Ayurved Medical College & Hospital, At. & Post Vahelal, Naroda-Dahegam Road, Ta. Dascroi, Dist. Ahmedabad-382330, Gujarat (Inst. ID. AYU0713)**, inspection of your College was conducted on **30.01.2024 & 31.01.2024 on Hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process **the 2nd renewal of Permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25, under Section 29 of NCISM ACT 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.**
- Further, in view of above, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulation namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", The Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On examining the case in light of above notified and approved criteria and on perusal of the visitation report, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria due to following shortcomings: -

- There is shortage of 1 lecture hall against the minimum requirements of 03.**
- Shortcoming in area of the teaching departments is as under:-**

5. Functionality of the hospital -

- There is shortage of 2041 number of patients attended OPD from 1st Jan 2023 to 31st Dec. 2023 against the minimum requirements of 3600.**
- Average attendance of patient in OPD per day is 113.20, Shortcomings of 6.803337.**
- There is shortage of 6.80 average attendance of patient in OPD per day against the minimum requirements of 120.**
- No deliveries conducted from 1st Jan 2023 to 31st Dec. 2023.

In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the **92nd Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on **31.05.2024**. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above the college was given an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even no.** dated **05.07.2024** to appear on **11.07.2024** before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the 2nd renewal of permission to your college with Monark Ayurved Medical College & Hospital, At. & Post Vahelal, Naroda-Dahegam Road, Ta. Dascroi, Dist. Ahmedabad-382330, Gujarat (Inst. ID. AYU0713) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020 be denied for the Academic Year 2024-25.**

3. The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide ref no. MAMCH/ADMN/NCISM-MARBH/Compliance/2024-25/008 dated 08.07.2024** against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Dr. Shirabhita Department of Basic principle.** appeared before the Hearing Committee on **11.07.2024** and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the Ayurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

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4. The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", "and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the **97th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) **held on 12.07.2024.**
5. In view of the observation of Hearing Committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report have been carefully examined in terms of concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and Board concluded that the college **is not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for Grant of 2nd renewal of Permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 29 of the NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25; as per the notified and approved criteria as per the regulation 3(3) of MSR 2016. However, Board decided to issue conditional permission as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 29 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2024-25.**

For every 10% deficiency in average attendance of patients in OPD per day seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 10 % of total intake capacity.

There is deficiency of 6.8 % in average attendance which is round off to 10% for issuance of conditional permission for academic session 2024-25. Therefore, in accordance of seat Reduction policy 2024-2025, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 10 % of total intake capacity..

Accordingly, after applying the seat reduction policy 2024-25 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 and, college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of 2nd renewal of permission with 54 seats instead of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25.

6. Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above and after applying seat reduction policy for the academic year 2024-25, **2nd renewal of Permission is granted to Monark Ayurved Medical College & Hospital, At. & Post Vahelal, Naroda-Dahegam Road, Ta. Dascroi, Dist. Ahmedabad-382330, Gujarat (Inst. ID. AYU0713) with 54 seats (instead of 60 seats) in UG (BAMS) course, under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations there under for the academic session 2024-25.**
- i. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
 - ii. It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 54 seats (instead of 60 seats)** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

- iii. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no.BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
8. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
9. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
10. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
11. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2023 and send a compliance report to get permission for the academic session 2025-26:**
- All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
 - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - Shorcoming mentioned in point no. 3(3) and 3(5)
12. The College administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the NCISM ACT and relevant regulation thereunder, are in position before the admission of the 4th batch of students in the 1st professional of BAMS is made, under intimation to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM.
13. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
